His early work in the Mission District of San Francisco and time living in Mexico City fueled his passion for helping underserved communities and deepened his appreciation for Mexican culture. Originally from California's San Joaquin Valley, he was raised on his family's ranch and values the importance of community and resilience. Gill and his wife, Kate, have been married for 29 years and have three adult children.
